## Pink Eye (Conjunctivitis)

- -When the transparent membrane (conjunctiva) that lines your eyelid and covers the white part of your eyeball becomes inflamed
- -Inflammation causes the small blood vessels to become inflamed, making them more visible, resulting in your eye appearing reddish or pink
- -Common causes include viruses, bacteria, allergies, chemical splash, a foreign object in the eye, and a blocked tear duct (newborns)
- -Viral or bacterial very contagious and are spread through direct or indirect contact with the liquid that drains from the eye of someone who's infected

-Can affect one eye or both
