Shingles

-Viral infection caused by herpes zoster

-Related varicella-zoster virus (chickenpox)

-Occurs in anyone who has had chickenpox but usually doesn't appear until most people are over the age of 50 (other things can trigger an earlier occurrence)

-Infection usually lasts 2-6 weeks

-Most only get shingles once, but some may get it two or more times
